Have them fill out parts A, B, & C of the Annual Health and Medical Record. This can take a while to schedule, don't wait!





# 3) FILL OUT IMPORTANT FORMS

Prescription Administration and Permission to depart the premises

Work with your troop leader to select the Scout's preferred merit badges and other special programs





#### 5) REVIEW "WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP" LIST

Ensure your Scout has everything they need for a successful week

## **NATIONAL BSA UPDATES**

#### **UPDATE TO BSA'S BARRIERS TO ABUSE**

As part of our ongoing commitment to abuse prevention, the Boy Scouts of America is updating the adult supervision requirements for overnight activities. This update enhances the minimum "two deep leadership" requirements by additionally requiring every adult present on overnight activities to be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America. These adults must submit an adult application and registration fee, undergo a criminal background check, a volunteer screening database check and must complete mandatory Youth Protection training.

#### What does this mean for you?

The previous "72-hour rule" (which allowed for an adult attending an overnight event not to register if attending for less than 72 hours) is eliminated.

A limited exception for parents and legal guardians of Cub Scout youth attending overnight with their children is planned due to the family centric nature of Cub Scouting. All Cub Scout Packs, Scouts BSA Troops, Exploring Posts, council, and district overnight programs will be required to comply with this update by September 1, 2023.

As a reminder, any adult attending Camp Klaus for Scouts BSA summer camp as a leader was already required to become a registered leader, and that policy will remain in place.

#### **NEW UNIFORM GUIDELINES**

Effective January 1, 2023, each Scouting unit may decide whether to wear shirts tucked in or untucked. Both tucked and untucked shirts should be neat in appearance.

For Scouts BSA, this decision should be made in consultation with unit youth leadership. The uniform symbolizes character development, leadership, citizen training and personal fitness; shows a sense of identification and commitment. #### **UNIT MONEY EARNING FORM**

When the Council office gets a call asking who is doing a mulch fundraiser, staff want to know the answer to their question. However, without a completed Unit Money Earning Application on file, staff may not be able to direct inquiries in the right direction.

As we prepare to send our youth to camp, recruit new youth and even host ice cream socials, units need to plan for future spending needs. Being prepared is what Scouts do, and this includes budgeting for the upcoming year. To avoid situations where staff cannot send inquiries to your fundraiser, please complete our Unit Money Earning Application as soon as you know of a fundraiser for your unit.

Troops, this is extremely important to get youth planning ahead and executing a successful fundraiser. The applications work through all the steps needed to complete a fundraiser. Let's be prepared!

#### MEMBERSHIP REGISTRATION FEE UPDATED

Effective April 1, 2023, all membership registration fees for youth or adult applications that are paid for by credit card, will be subject to a 3.5% credit card processing fee. Check or cash payments will still be accepted with no additional fees. Please note, this does NOT impact other fees paid to the council (i.e. event / camp registration, scout shop purchases, etc).

#### **GRANTS FOR EAGLE SCOUTS**

Starting the journey to complete your Eagle Scout rank? Make sure to use the new Eagle Scout Workbook (https://www.scouting.org/programs/scouts-bsa/advancement-and-awards/eagle-scoutworkbook/) If you have started your workbook already, you do not need to transition to the new workbook.

As an Eagle Scout, you will be in charge of the entire process of making your project a reality. This includes budgeting and finding funding. Did you know the City of Dubuque has two grants currently open you can apply for?


