The Scouter Appreciation Dinner is YOUR chance to help recognize our outstanding leaders. Nominations are open for:

<u>Cub Scouter of the Year:</u> This award is available to a new or experienced leader of a Cub Scout Pack. Nominations should be submitted to the district awards selection committee.

<u>Scouts BSA Scouter of the Year:</u> This award is available to a new or experienced leader of a Scouts BSA Troop. Nominations should be submitted to the district awards selection committee.

<u>Venturer of the Year:</u> This award is available to a new or experienced leader of a Venture Crew. Nominations should be submitted to the district awards selection committee.

<u>District Award of Merit:</u> This award is available to any registered Scouter who renders service of an outstanding nature on a district-wide level. This is a Council award presented by each District.

<u>Silver Beaver Award:</u> This is the highest honor a Council can bestow upon a volunteer. It is a National recognition, awarded at the Council's request. Nominations for this award should consist of service from a volunteer that measures far above the norm of expectations. The candidate must have noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth within the Council.

Nominations are currently open through January 11 for district and council-level awards that recognize excellence in volunteer Scouters. These awards serve as a platform to honor those who have made a significant impact on the Scouting programs. We urge you consider nominating someone you know.

Applications for Eagle Scout scholarships are now open through January 31, 2024. In all, there are 9 scholarships available from the National Eagle Scout Association.

Scholarships are awarded to Eagle Scouts who have shown active participation in school, Scouting activities, and community service, and who demonstrate they understand the fundamentals of service to community, service to Scouting and their character. They should also demonstrate that, if they have a financial need, what distinguishes their financial need from others.
