WHY CUB SCOUT CAMP?

- Earn achievements towards belt loops and pins (fill that belt up!)

IS YOUR TROOP PREPARED?

How should Scouts BSA Troops prepare for camp?

- -Read the Leader/Parent guide HERE!
- -Register any leader that MAY attend camp as an adult leader in your unit NOW! (Background check now must be processed before they can be a leader; give at least 3 weeks to process!)
- -Collect commitment to attend / deposits from Scouts and Leaders
- -Communicate regularly to parents
- -Share <u>Merit Badge Guide</u> Advise on what badges Scouts should take based on their age and ability level (Reminder not to schedule merit badges during Troop time if applicable.)
- -Share Campership form (scholarship)
- -Share packing list and dress code
- -Hold new Scout / first time camper orientation with youth and parents (after crossover)
- -Check troop equipment for needs
