YOUTH PROTECTION MISSION STATEMENT

True youth protection can be achieved only through the focused commitment of everyone in Scouting. It is the mission of Youth Protection volunteers and professionals who work within the Boy Scouts of America to maintain a culture of Youth Protection awareness and safety at the national, territory, area, council, district, and unit levels.

MANDATORY YOUTH PROTECTION TRAINING - MORE INFO

Youth Protection Training (YPT) is required for all BSA registered volunteers and must be renewed every two years. If YPT is expired, their registration will be suspended, and they will not be permitted to serve as a leader until the training is updated.

BARRIERS TO ABUSE - MORE INFO

The BSA has adopted policies for the safety and well-being of its members. These policies primarily protect youth members; however, they also serve to protect adult leaders. All parents and caregivers should understand that our leaders are to abide by these safeguards. Registered leaders, parents, and youth are strongly encouraged to use these safeguards outside the Scouting program.

THE GUIDE TO SAFE SCOUTING ACTIVITIES - MORE INFO


Registered unit leaders are expected to review the additional reference material cited prior to conducting activities. In situations not specifically covered in this guide, activity planners should evaluate the risk or potential risk of harm, and respond with action plans based on common sense, community standards, the Scout motto, and safety policies and practices commonly prescribed for the activity by experienced providers and practitioners.
